Das Rittergut Jordansmühl liegt an der Breslau-Glatzer Chaussee $4\frac{1}{4}$ Meile von Breslau, $2\frac{1}{2}$ Meile von der Kreisstadt Nimptsch und wird von der grossen Lohe durchflossen. Jordansmühl mit dem Dorfe gleichen Namens hat 900 Einwohner; am Orte befindet sich eine Poststation, eine evangelische Kirche und Schule worüber der Besitzer Patron ist.

Lieutenant in der Landwehr Gustav Karl Ludwig Schwartz verkaufte, welcher den Besitz durch die am

Orte dazu gehörige Brauerei und die bei Nimptsch gelegenen Forstparzellen durch Abzweigung verkleinerte.

Am 13. Juni 1862 kaufte es der Rittergutsbesitzer Johann Karl Christian Kriegsheim auf Grünungen in Thüringen, welcher es am 13. Juli 1863 seinem zweiten Sohne Selmar Kriegsheim, dem gegenwärtigen Besitzer überliess.

Das Rittergut umfasst jetzt noch 1644 Morgen Acker und Wiesen.
